WELCOME TO LEADVILLE



Safety tips while training from the Leadville Police Department and Lake County Sheriff's Office:

BICYCLISTS

- Ride single file with the flow of traffic
- Observe all traffic signs and traffic laws
- Wear proper reflective clothing and safety equipment
- Use hand signals when stopping and making turns
- Make sure your bike is in good working order before you begin your ride
- Bicycles should be ridden on the streets and roads instead of sidewalks
- All athletes and spectators should follow public decency rules: No public nudity and no public urination

MOTORISTS

- · Drive at or below the posted speed limit
- · Yield to all emergency vehicles by pulling over to your right as far as you safely can
- · Adjust your speed during adverse weather conditions
- Designate a sober driver or call a cab
- When school bus lights are flashing yellow and red, slow down and stop
- · Stop for pedestrians in crosswalks

PEDESTRIANS

- Always use the crosswalks
- While walking or running on a roadway, move against traffic
- While running on a roadway, wear bright and or reflective clothing
- All athletes and spectators should follow public decency rules: No public nudity and no public urination

PUBLIC PARKING

- There are four public parking lots:
 - West 3rd and Harrison Ave
 - East 4th behind the Tabor Opera House
 - 1000 W 4th, High School North Lot
 - Community Park across the street from the North Lot at the intersection of W 6th Street and McWethy

STREET PARKING

- Diagonal parking is permitted on the south side of the street up to the alley on the following streets:
 - East 8th
 - East 7th
 - East 6th
 - East 5th
 - East 4th
- Resident parking spaces are clearly marked with a red and white sign. If you park in one of these spaces you will be ticketed and your vehicle may be towed
- Park in the direction of traffic and 12 inches or less from the curb
- There is a two-hour time limit for parking in some areas.





IMPORTANT NEW *COURSE MODIFICATIONS*

The course for 2021 has been modified to account for private property owners, as well as safety. The changes are outlined below.

- ~43 Miles / 59 Miles Private Property we will not use the private property riders will exit the trail, turn left towards Lost Canyon road and then turn right back towards the powerlines, taking the powerlines to FR398 (Lost Canyon) before heading up to Columbine. Riders will use the same route in reverse inbound. Map here
 - **Why?** This ensures that we are not encroaching on private property.
- **~68 Miles County Road 10** riders will stay on county road 10 for approximately 0.75 miles before turning left on CR136, taking a right on to Trail 130S at mile 70.4. Map here
 - **Why?** This allows for no congestion on single track inbound for lead riders or outbound for riders near the back
- ~51.8 Miles Columbine Turnaround athletes will turn around before
 the cabin at a larger area.
 - Why? This change will ensure we are not adding substantially
 different mileage jeopardizing 9hr and 12hr buckle
 cutoffs. Additionally USFS has new signage limiting vehicles near
 the historic turnaround. Lastly, the area is larger and allows for a
 more natural turnaround. Map here

- Rules of the Road Obey the rules of the road, as the roads are not closed to traffic
- Know the course! Athletes are reminded that while courses are marked, it is your responsibility to know the course

NEW FOR 2021:

In collaboration with the Lake County Health Department and USFS, we are limiting each rider to the following:

- 2 crew members 16 and under do not count towards 2.
 - Crew members will be required to wear wristbands at all times
- 1 vehicle hang tag hang tags should be visible and will have your bib number on it

CREW LOCATIONS:

• There are 3 crew locations: riders will hit each location twice.

NOTE: crewing outside of these 3 locations is against official race rules and will result in disqualification of your rider.

PARKING:

- Attendants will assist you with parking
- Park only in designated areas
- Do not disturb wildlife or vegetation

CREW INFORMATION



CREW RULES: Crew must abide by Lake Country & Chaffee County laws, race rules, listen and respect ALL Leadville Race Series Staff, Volunteers, and personnel in enforcement uniform or vests.

If you fail to abide and respect our community you will be asked to leave and your athlete may be disqualified!

CREW DO'S:

- Crews can provide food, drinks and supplies
- Crews may furnish replacement bike parts and offer mechanical assistance. Ex: replacement chain.
- Pets are allowed must be leashed and under control at all times.
- Setup permitted at sunrise on race day 8/14/21.

CREW DON'TS - GROUNDS FOR DISQUALIFICATION:

- Crewing outside of 3 official crew locations Pipeline, Twin Lakes Dam & Twin Lakes Alternate.
- No crew bikes, please. Crews should allow adequate time to park and walk to aid stations.
- Riders must complete the entire course using the original bike frame, no changing of bikes is allowed.
- Littering
- Illegal parking
- No camping arrive only on race day only

CORRAL INFO



RACE START

Please give yourself plenty of time on race day, expect there to be a lot of traffic/parking may be difficult.

- 5:00am Corrals open
- **6:15am** All athletes should be in their corrals with their bikes
 - Reminder Be sure to have your bike plate affixed to your handlebars
- 6:25am Ghost bikes will be removed
- 6:30am RACE START

CORRAL RULES

- Riders will be in pre-assigned color-coded corrals. Corrals will be clearly marked.
- Riders must start in assigned corral.
- If you do not start in your assigned corral you will be disqualified

CORRAL START TIMES

- 6:30am RACE START
- 6:30am Gold AND Silver
- **6:32am -** Red
- **6:35am** Green
- **6:38am -** Purple
- **6:41am -** Orange
- **6:45am** Blue
- **6:49am -** White

Not in the right corral?

If you believe that you have a finish time that would place you in a faster corral, here are the steps needed:

- 1. <u>View our 2021 corral chart</u> for corral assignments and eligible races.
- 2. Send a screenshot or the direct link to your results to us at leadville@ltevents.zendesk.com for us to verify and consider re-corralling you.
- 3. You will receive the final word on your corral by August 6th.



IMPORTANT INFO



RACE NUMBERS

- Race Numbers must be visible at all times, tied to the handlebars of your bike.
- DO NOT cut or fold your number this may damage the timing chip and impact your timing data

TIMING

- **Chip Time** your time starts when you cross the timing mat at the start, and ends when you cross the timing mat when you finish accounting for all elapsed time on the course.
- **Gun Time** your time starts when the race starts (6:30am).
- **Reminder** Chip time will be used to determine your belt buckle eligibility and there will be no changes to those times.
- NOTE: Top 3 men and women overall times will be based solely on gun time.
- You may follow your athlete's results and split times on the Athlinks app. Results and photos will also be available here: <u>VIEW RESULTS & PHOTOS</u>

BUCKLE TIMES

- All buckle times are based on individual rider CHIP time.
- 9-hour cutoff time = BIG BUCKLE
- 12-hour cutoff time = SMALL BUCKLE and official finisher

COURSE CUTOFFS

- All course cutoffs are based on GUN time
- Course cutoffs have been extended by 15 minutes to account for wave start times

WEATHER

- Leadville temperatures in August vary from daytime highs in the upper 70s to nighttime lows in the upper 20s. Expect sunny mornings and afternoon showers, and. Be prepared for the Colorado high country's volatile weather: During the race, it could rain. Hail and even snow. Lightning is hazardous, especially above the timberline. Hypothermia easily occurs with a combination of decreasing temperatures, wind and precipitation. It can result in confusion, and this can be deadly. We strongly suggest you bring the following items:
 - Rain gear
 - Windbreaker with hood
 - Polypro or wool socks, hat, and gloves.
- No matter the weather, DO NOT attempt the round trip to Columbine Mine without adequate warm and protective clothing. Remember, the Columbine Mine is at 12,600 feet.

TRASH AND RECYCLING

- Our local zero waste non-profit, <u>Cloud City Conservation Center</u>, is hosting our recycling program.
- This is a zero waste event.
- There will be recycling/compost containers at all full aid stations and at the start/finish line,
- Please place any waste in the proper bin.
- GU's TerraCycle containers will also be available for disposal of nutrition related waste.
- Reminder Intentional littering on the course will be grounds for disqualification.





LEAVE NO TRACE



PLAN AHEAD AND PREPARE

- Know the regulations and special concerns for the area you'll visit.
- Prepare for extreme weather, hazards and emergencies.

TRAVEL AND CAMP ON DURABLE SURFACES

- Durable surfaces include established trails and campsites, rock, gravel or dry grasses.
- Good campsites are found, not made. Altering a site is not necessary.

DISPOSE OF WASTE PROPERLY

- Pack it in, pack it out.
- Deposit solid human waste in catholes dug six-to-eight inches deep at least 200 feet from water, camp and trails. Cover and disguise the cathole when finished.

LEAVE WHAT YOU FIND

- Preserve the past: examine, but do not touch, cultural or historic structures and artifacts.
- Leave rocks, plants and other natural objects as you find them.

MINIMIZE CAMPFIRE IMPACTS

- Campfires can cause lasting impacts to the backcountry. Use a lightweight stove for cooking and enjoy a
 candle lantern for light.
- Where fires are permitted, use established fire rings, fire pans or mound fires.

RESPECT WILDLIFE

- Observe wildlife from a distance. Do not follow or approach them.
- Never feed animals. Feeding wildlife damages their health, alters natural behaviors and exposes them to predators and other dangers.

BE CONSIDERATE OF OTHER VISITORS

- Respect other visitors and protect the quality of their experience.
- Be courteous. Yield to other users on the trail.

SPECTATOR GUIDELINES

This event is held on the San Isabel National Forest under a special permit. Check out their guidelines.

- · Follow Hwy 24 over Tennessee Pass to Leadville


PUEBLO (153 MILES)
